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EXPLANATORY NOTE: This Amendment No. 7 to Schedule 13D (<u>Amendment No. 7</u>) relates to the Class A Common Stock, \$0.01 par value per share, of Hyatt Hotels Corporation, a Delaware corporation (the <u>Issuer</u>), which has its principal executive office at 71 South Wacker Drive, 12th Floor, Chicago, Illinois 60606. This Amendment No. 7 amends and supplements, as set forth below, the Schedule 13D filed by the Reporting Persons with respect to the Issuer on August 26, 2010 (the <u>Original Schedule 13D</u>), as amended and supplemented by Amendment No. 1 to Schedule 13D filed by the Reporting Persons on September 8, 2010 (<u>Amendment No. 1</u>), Amendment No. 2 to Schedule 13D filed by the Reporting Persons on May 18, 2011 (<u>Amendment No. 2</u>), Amendment No. 3 to Schedule 13D filed by the Reporting Persons on December 19, 2011 (<u>Amendment No. 3</u>), Amendment No. 4 to Schedule 13D filed by the Reporting Persons on December 19, 2011 (<u>Amendment No. 4</u>), Amendment No. 5 to Schedule 13D filed by the Reporting Persons on January 4, 2012 (<u>Amendment No. 5</u>) and Amendment No. 6 to Schedule 13D filed by the Reporting Persons on August 17, 2012 (<u>Amendment No. 6</u>). The Original Schedule 13D, as amended and supplemented by Amendment No. 1, Amendment No. 2, Amendment No. 3, Amendment No. 4, Amendment No. 5 and Amendment No. 6, is referred to as the Schedule 13D. All capitalized terms not otherwise defined herein have the meanings ascribed to them in the Schedule 13D. The Schedule 13D is amended and supplemented by adding the information contained herein. Only those items amended are reported herein.

#### Item 3. Source and Amount of Funds or Other Consideration

Item 3 of the Schedule 13D is amended and supplemented as follows:

On November 30, 2012, Thomas J. Pritzker, Marshall E. Eisenberg and Karl J. Breyer resigned as co-trustees of each of the U.S. Situs Trusts. Marshall E. Eisenberg was appointed as sole successor trustee of certain of such trusts, which are listed on Appendix A-4 hereto (the Change of Trustee). Due to the Change of Trustee, the shares of Common Stock held by the trusts listed on Appendix A-4 hereto are now beneficially owned by Marshall E. Eisenberg, solely in his capacity as trustee of such trusts. No consideration was paid in connection with the Change of Trustee and the Change of Trustee constitutes a Permitted Transfer as defined in the Issuer's Amended and Restated Certificate of Incorporation and, accordingly, the shares of Class B Common Stock held by the trusts listed on Appendix A-4 hereto remain shares of Class B Common Stock following the Change of Trustee.

#### **Item 4. Purpose of Transaction**

Item 4 of the Schedule 13D is amended and supplemented as follows:

The Change of Trustee was completed on November 30, 2012, as described in Item 3 of this Amendment No. 7.

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#### Item 5. Interest in Securities of the Issuer

Item 5 of the Schedule 13D is amended and supplemented as follows:

(a)-(b) As of the date hereof, the Reporting Persons in the aggregate may be deemed to be the beneficial owners of 20,900,329 shares of Class A Common Stock, issuable upon conversion of 20,900,329 shares of Class B Common Stock beneficially owned by the Reporting Persons. Based on the number of shares of Class B Common Stock outstanding as of October 26, 2012, the number of shares of Class B Common Stock beneficially owned by the Reporting Persons represents 17.6% of the total number of shares of Class B Common Stock outstanding. Based on the number of shares of Common Stock outstanding as of October 26, 2012, the number of shares of Common Stock beneficially owned by the Reporting Persons represents 12.7% of the total number of shares of Common Stock outstanding and 17.0% of the total voting power of the shares of Common Stock outstanding, voting together as a single class, assuming that no outstanding shares of Class B Common Stock have been converted into shares of Class A Common Stock.

Thomas J. Pritzker holds 59,853 stock appreciation rights (SARs) that are currently exercisable at an exercise price of \$40.96 and 31,852 SARs that are currently exercisable at an exercise price of \$41.74. Each SAR gives the holder the right to receive a number of shares of Class A Common Stock equal to the excess of the value of one share of Class A Common Stock at the exercise date, over the exercise price. The number of shares of Class A Common Stock that Mr. Pritzker will receive upon exercise of such SARs is not determinable until the date of exercise and therefore is not included in the information above.

Schedule A attached to this Amendment No. 7 amends and restates, in its entirety, Schedule A attached to the Schedule 13D. Schedule A attached to this Amendment No. 7 sets forth, as of the date hereof, the number of shares and percentage of the Class A Common Stock outstanding, the number of shares and percentage of the Class B Common Stock outstanding, the percentage of the total number of shares of Common Stock outstanding, and the percentage of the total voting power of the shares of Common Stock outstanding, voting together as a single class, represented by the shares beneficially owned by each Reporting Person. Certain shares beneficially owned by John A. Miller, as Trustee, are held indirectly by T11M2 HHC, L.L.C., THHC, L.L.C., T11M2 Investors, L.L.C. and T11M5 Investors, L.L.C., each of which are member-managed Delaware limited liability companies formed for the purpose of acquiring shares of the Issuer s Common Stock. The limited liability companies are wholly owned by one or more of the trusts listed on Appendix A-3 and have no voting or dispositive power with regard to the shares.

Schedule B attached to this Amendment No. 7 amends and restates, in its entirety, Schedule B attached to the Schedule 13D. Schedule B attached to this Amendment No. 7 sets forth, as of the date hereof, the number of shares and percentage of the Class A Common Stock outstanding, the number of shares and percentage of the Class B Common Stock outstanding, the percentage of the total number of shares of Common

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Stock outstanding, and the percentage of the total voting power of the shares of Common Stock outstanding, voting together as a single class, represented by the shares beneficially owned by the Reporting Persons and each Separately Filing Group Member. All information with regard to the Separately Filing Group Members is based solely on the information contained in the Schedule 13Ds filed by the Separately Filing Group Members.

The Change of Trustee did not impact the number of shares or the percentage of the Common Stock beneficially owned by the Pritzker Family Group.

(c) The Change of Trustee was completed on November 30, 2012, as described in Item 3 of this Amendment No. 7.

#### Item 6. Contracts, Arrangements, Understandings or Relationships with Respect to Securities of the Issuer

Item 6 of the Schedule 13D is amended and supplemented as follows:

On November 30, 2012, Marshall E. Eisenberg, not individually, but solely as trustee of the trusts listed on <u>Appendix A-4</u>, executed a joinder to, and thereby became subject to the provisions of, the Global Hyatt Agreement.
